Employment

International students enrolled in Singapore's public universities and polytechnics, as well as foreign institutes of higher learning, are allowed to work part-time, up to 16 hours per week during the school term, and work full-time during vacations.

Students will need to obtain prior permission from the Student Liaison/ Affairs Office at their educational institution. International students enrolled in Private educational institutions are not allowed to work part-time during their course.
